NURSERY

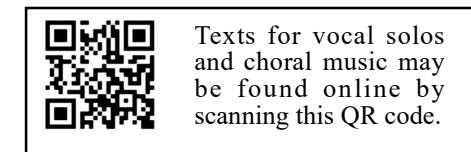

From the Pews, Christopher Hanson

Back in college, I went on a Fall retreat every year with an on-campus Christian organization. Going on the retreat required little “investment” – typically, showing up on a Friday morning to meet a yellow school bus that would whisk our group away to a Christian retreat center in the wilds of Connecticut or New Hampshire. The trip required minimal preparation on my part, mainly throwing some clothes and my Bible in a backpack. Despite this lack of investment, the Fall retreat rewarded me handsomely every year – filling me with the Holy Spirit, uniting me in community with fellow Christians, displaying the wonders of God’s beauty, and providing a respite from the busyness back on campus.

Since moving to Greenville in 2021 and joining Westminster, I have gone on similar retreats. My husband, Blake, and I joined fellow pilgrims on the Civil Rights bus tour of Alabama last August, and I attended the Men’s Retreat at Montreat this April. Both retreats were like my college experiences – little investment, high reward. In Alabama, Blake and I forged deep, intergenerational relationships while learning about the darkest chapters in our nation’s and faith’s history. And, we all know the magic that is Montreat.

But, now reflecting more deeply on my college and Westminster retreats, I realize that this “little investment, high reward” narrative is a false one. There was a lot of investment on the front end – before ever stepping foot on a yellow school bus or crossing the cobblestone entrance gate of Montreat. In college, I often spent the night before the retreat burning the midnight oil writing a seminar paper or tackling a problem set that I would not have time to work on over the weekend. I often showed up to the bus exhausted having invested in the work that needed to be done so I could spend three days away from campus. In going to Alabama, Blake and I both had to save a coveted vacation day and finish work assignments and meetings in advance of taking off that Friday and weekend. We even had to complete assigned readings ahead of time – thanks, Leigh.

Reaping the spiritual and meaningful benefits of the retreats required investment – in the form of time, energy, commitment, and love. The same is true for Westminster as a whole, not just our church retreats. These investments as well as our gifts to the church are necessary to continue to sow the seeds of faith and to be diligent stewards of our families, Greenville, the Upstate, and beyond. And, that is why Blake and I are increasing our pledge to Westminster this year. It is not an “investment” to reap rewards – but it is a commitment of love to God, to one another, and to you.
